### Wildlife Habitat

Current fashion is to focus wildlife habitat in blocks or rows. It is easy to plant and maintain and provides a quick visual impact of an apparent increase in wildlife populations. We take exception to this. Keep in mind that this concentration of wildlife will also be noted by the predators. If you want to truly maximize wildlife populations you should disperse your wildlife plantings as much as possible. Wildlife, like people, tend to be territorial so dispersed plantings will accommodate these territories. To draw wildlife and people out of natural dispersal invites stress, disease, warfare and predation. Research done in Minnesota on ruffed grouse indicated that overall populations could be increased as much as 20X by proper dispersal of habitat!

Another fact to keep in mind is that diversity of feed is important to wildlife. For reasons not fully understood, wildlife doesn't always show preference for the same food from year to year or site to site in spite of availability. Also, winter fruit isn't born by the same species every winter. To maximize fruit, seed and nut crops, do not crowd your plantings.

### ORDERING INFORMATION

All stock is bareroot. Spring orders are usually shipped in April unless you specify otherwise. Fall deciduous shipments are usually in November, after leaf fall. Most conifers are best shipped in September or April, when the soil is at the proper moisture and temperature (55°F+) for new root development. Southern orders have first priority as our frozen ground will allow. Stock is guaranteed fresh and healthy upon delivery. Please inspect your plants immediately upon delivery. If the plants are not wanted for any reason, they should be returned within 1 week, otherwise contact Cold Stream Farm immediately for alternate return instructions. Shipping cost is the responsibility of the customer. Restocking fees may apply to returned orders.

FALL EVERGREEN SHIPMENTS ARE NOT GUARANTEED due to the significance of environmental factors. EVERGREENS OVER 24" ARE NOT GUARANTEED. All deciduous and spring shipped evergreens under 24" are guaranteed to leaf or bud out. Guarantee does not extend past bud/leaf break. All claims for stock failing to leaf or bud must be made before June or within 30 days of delivery. Store credit on account will be provided for all approved claims. Store credit can be used toward either the purchase of replacement stock or any alternate species.

Stock shipping to locations outside the United States are not guaranteed.

All trees are State inspected and guaranteed fresh and healthy at shipment.

Payment in full is due prior to shipment. Payment is due March 1 on orders placed during the winter. Allow 10 days for personal checks to clear the bank, otherwise pay by bank check, money order, or credit card. AFTER MARCH 1, ORDERS MAY BE CANCELED IF NOT PAID. Orders to be shipped out positively before April 1 should be placed before December and paid for at the time of ordering, so we can store them in our locker. Pick up orders must be paid in advance. Guarantee is void if not picked up on time. Early fall orders of mixed evergreen and deciduous must be placed as two separate orders since they should be shipped at different times.

Past due accounts are subject to 1-1/2% per month service charge.

Custom bundling charge is \$ .50 per bundle if you require stock to be bundled in numbers other than normal.

Canadian orders will incur additional fee for inspection and phytosanitary certificate.

  - 5 Plant in partial shade to discourage insect attack.
